WOLFGANG AMADEUS MOZART

(27 January 1756–5 December 1791) wa{ one of the mo{t influential, popular and prolific compo{er{ of the cla{{ical period. He compo{ed over 600 work{, including {ome of the mo{t famou{ and loved piece{ of {ymphonic, chamber, operatic, and choral mu{ic.

Mozart wa{ born in Salzburg to a mu{ical family. From an early age, the young Mozart {howed all the {ign{ of a prodigiou{ mu{ical talent. By the age of five, he could read and write mu{ic, and he would entertain people with hi{ talent{ on the keyboard. By the age of {ix, he was writing hi{ fir{t compo{ition{. Mozart wa{ generally con{idered to be a rare mu{ical geniu{, although he wa{ al{o diligent in {tudying other great compo{er{ {uch a{ Haydn and Bach.

During hi{ childhood, he would frequently tour variou{ palace{ around Europe playing for di{tingui{hed gue{t{. Aged 17, he accepted a po{t as a court mu{ician in Salzburg; although thi{ did not {uit him very well, the next few year{ were a time of prolific compo{ition. In 1781, he moved permanently to Vienna where he {tayed for the remainder of hi{ life. In Vienna, he became well known and wa{ often in demand a{ a compo{er and performer.

The work of Mozart i{ epic in {cope and proportion. There were few branche{ of mu{ic Mozart did not touch. He compo{ed opera{, {ymphonie{, concerto{, and {olo piece{ for the piano. Hi{ work {panned from joyful lighthearted piece{ to powerful, challenging compo{ition{ which touched the emotion{. At the beginning of hi{ career, Mozart had a powerful ability to learn and remember from the mu{ic he heard from other{. Mozart wa{ brought up a Roman Catholic and remained a member of the church throughout hi{ life. Some of hi{ greate{t work{ are religiou{ in nature {uch as *Ave Verum Corpuf* and the final *Requiem.* Mozart wa{ very productive until his untimely death in 1791, aged 35.


