DIRECTOR'S NOTES

My favourite part of theatre is the opportunity to leave yourself behind and walk in another person's shoes for a couple of hours. While it's fun to pretend to be Tom, Dick or Harry, the weird and wonderful oddballs of the world are the most exciting to explore - and you don't get much weirder or more wonderful than those who live within the crumbling walls of Gormenghast castle.

Mervyn Peake brought these eccentric souls to life in his trilogy of gothic fantasy novels: *Titus Groan* (1946), *Gormenghast* (1950) and *Titus Alone* (1959). Although often compared to J.R.R. Tolkien, Peake was more influenced by the works of Dickens and Stevenson. Where Tolkien expanded Middle Earth further out, Peake extended inward - layering detail upon detail to the ancient lore and bizarre customs and practices of the Groan family and their subjects.

But how is it possible to fit this elaborate world onto a simple stage and condense this sprawling plot into a single evening? We need look no further than this impressive script from John Constable who was commissioned to write a stage adaptation for the physical theatre director David Glass and his ensemble. Just as Peake looks within, Constable has drilled down to the heart of the story and avoided getting bogged down in too literal a view of the series.





An enormous amount of effort has been poured into this production by everyone involved, both on and off stage - each and every aspect has been a challenge: physical theatre, puppetry, properties, costuming and make-up, lighting and sound effects. I cannot thank my wonderful cast and crew enough for their hard work in bringing this passion project of mine to life. I'll be forever grateful and this entire experience will always hold a very special place in my heart.

Although this production features many familiar Studio 61 faces, we're delighted to introduce four new members to the stage this evening: Matthew Barnes as Swelter, Katie Hallam as The Thing, Billy Haynes as Titus and Emily May as Fuchsia. It has been a pleasure working with you all and we hope you'll join us for many more productions in the future.

A final "thank you" must be extended to you as our audience this evening. Many amateur drama groups are still struggling to regain their audience numbers after such a long break. Thank you for supporting the local arts and we hope you enjoy the show this evening as much as we will performing it.

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




