I first read Nigel Slater's biography "Toast: The Story of a Boy's Hunger" when it was published in 2003. I loved the book and found it easy to identify with the descriptions of food and sweets from my childhood. It was also evocative of locations

in and around Wolverhampton including "the mon on the hoss".

The next landmark was the BBC film in 2010 featuring Ken Stott as Dad and Helena Bonham-Carter as Joan. The play adapted from the book by Henry Filloux-Bennett was only released for amateur performance late last year and I jumped at the chance to direct it for Studio 61

I can't say directing the play has all been plain sailing, far from it. Due to changed circumstances our original Nigel had to stand down in early January and a replacement had to be found in double quick time. Thankfully, Zak Wadley stepped into






