# BACKGROUND

# **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

On 11th March 2011, the most powerful earthquake ever recorded in Japan struck off the country's eastern coast triggering a tsunami which swept over Japan's main island of Honshu, killing more than 18,000 people and wiping entire towns off the map.

Waves over 14 metres high surged over coastal defences and flooded the reactors at the Fukushima Nuclear Power Plant, sparking a major disaster. Authorities set up an exclusion zone which grew larger and larger as radiation leaked from the plant, forcing more than 150,000 people to evacuate from the area.

Lucy Kirkwood's play draws on this disaster, imagining the aftermath of a similar event in the UK. Hazel and Robin's organised world comes crashing down as Rose, a friend from the past, confronts them with a moral dilemma. The play deals with issues of guilt, morality and responsibility and brings into sharp focus the topic of climate change.

With the increasing frequency and intensity of extreme climatic events, Hazel's "we shouldn't have to deal with this shit" is the cry of a society which stands by, wringing its hands while carrying on business as usual.

When the play opened at The Royal Court in 2016, Kirkwood said "We have a finite planet so the play was always a bit about the battle between wanting more and looking at what you can actually have."

In the play, Hazel says how frightened she is about what's happening, but she doesn't know 'how to want less'. Something we can all identify with but also something we need to address – before it's too late.

#### **SUZANNE SMITH as ROSE**

Roles have included Joanna in "Present Laughter", the Empress of China and the good fairy in some fun pantomimes, Barbara in "Pack of Lies" and several lovely funny yet poignant Ayckbourn roles. Directorial duties include "The School for Scandal", "The Village Fête" and "Arcadia" and she is directing the next production, "An Experiment with an Air Pump".

She cannot quite understand the complaints that there are no good parts for older women. Her favourite roles up to now have been the almost demential Cissy in Stafford Players' production of "Quartet" and HRH Elizabeth II in Studio 61's "Handbagged", and she considers this part to be a cracker!


